

Pretoria/Tshwane Declaration on the Chagos Question

We, the participants at the International Conference on the Status of the Chagos Islands, hosted by the Institute for Pan African Thought and Conversation (IPATC) which is part of the University of Johannesburg, conscious of the plight of the Chagossian people across the globe,

Noting that the Chagossians are an Indigenous People of the Chagos Islands as per the definition of the United Nations Declaration on Indigenous People 2007,

Cognizant that their status as an Indigenous People of the Chagos Islands is based on their ancestors' presence on the Chagos Islands as early as 1793 as enslaved people from Mozambique and Madagascar who were later joined by indentured labourers from India,

Recognizing that Chagossians have been subjected to French and British slavery and colonial rule, and have been living in exile for over 50 years since the UK and US governments conspired to expel them to Mauritius and Seychelles during construction of the US military base on Diego Garcia,

Aware that the Chagos Islands are still under colonial rule by the UK government, having been established as a brand-new colony in 1965 by way of the British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT) Ordinance.

Noting the failure of the UK government to cooperate with the Mauritian government in facilitating the resettlement of the Chagos islands (as required by the International Court of Justice Advisory Opinion of the Legal Consequences of the Separation of the Chagos Archipelago from Mauritius in 1965 and the United Nations General Assembly Resolution 73/295),

Further noting that Chagossians continue to live in conditions of poverty and marginalisation,

Expressing our loyal and unstinting support for and solidarity with all Chagossians.

Calling for Chagossian unity in pursuit of the many goals that they share.

Hereby declare that:

- 1. Chagossians have a fundamental human right to return to the Chagos Archipelago to visit or resettle there as they desire.
- 2. The relevant authorities including Mauritius, UK, and US governments should support and facilitate the return to and resettlement of the Chagos islands.
- 3. The US military must end all employment discrimination against Chagossians and give them the opportunity to work on the base on Diego Garcia.
- 4. The UK and US governments were primarily responsible for the displacement and consequently for over 50 years of harm and should therefore provide full and proper compensation, without prejudice to the right of resettlement.
- 5. Chagossians have an inalienable right to self-determination.
- 6. Chagossians alone have the right to decide when and how to exercise their right to self-determination, whether statehood or association with any other state.
